





FEBRUARY 9TH ANNUAL CHAMBER DINNER WILL CELEBRATE THE LEGACY OF "CITIZENS OF THE YEAR"



On Thursday, February 9th, the Greater Miami Shores Chamber of Commerce will hold its Annual Dinner. This festive and well attended event is usually the pinnacle of the Chamber's year and programming. The evening begins with our Annual Meeting at 5:30 p.m., which is open to all members and provides you with an opportunity to ask questions of Chamber leadership and hear about plans for 2017.

At 6:30 p.m., attendees will gather for complimentary hors d'ouevres and a cash bar. Dinner is served at 7:30 p.m. All events are being held at the Miami Shores Country Club, 10000 Biscayne Boulevard in Miami Shores. Tickets are \$100 and a table of eight is \$750.

Each year at our Annual Dinner we honor the "Citizen of the Year". This year we selected two community treasures who unfortunately left us in 2016, Susan Dombrowsky and Jerry Estep.

The late **Jerry Estep** served as Recreation Director for Miami Shores Village from 2000 until his untimely death this past June. Prior to that Jerry oversaw the Recreation and Parks Department for the city of Hollywood for seven years and held a similar position for nine years in Gulfport, Mississippi. He

was born in Roswell, New Mexico in 1953, raised in Gulfport, and was a graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi. An avid fisherman, he and his wife, Miami Shores Village Clerk Barbara Estep, were frequent visitors to the Florida Keys. He served as a board member for the Chamber of Commerce as well as being a member of the Green Day Committee.

Susan Clifford Dombrowsky, MD, was born on October 14, 1943 to William Clifford, M.D. and Kathryn Clifford who moved their family to Miami Shores in the 1960's.

Susan, the eldest of eight children, followed her father's footsteps into medicine. She went to University of Miami Medical School, at a time when women did not. She became the doctor for generations of families she treated from her Miami Shores practice. All of her patients would agree (including the ones she stitched up in her kitchen) that she was a gifted diagnostician and ultimately a true healer.

To Susan, family and education were paramount. Through her hard work, she ensured that she was able to travel the world with her family—never fancy, but always fun with an educational purpose. Susan and her husband Alan also made

sure that every evening they shared supper together—interrupted only for educational purposes as she sent one of the boys to fetch the Encyclopedia Britannica or Oxford Unabridged Dictionary.

Susan also believed that one must also give back to the community. In addition to serving her generations of patients, Susan was also an active participant in a number of national and local charities too numerous to list. Susan also sat on the Barry University Board of Trustees and later on the Doctors Charter School Board. Notably, Susan was Miami Shores Chamber of Commerce President in 1989, a time when she had a thriving medical practice, and three school age sons. Those who knew Susan would agree that she possessed a work ethic, energy, and dedication paralleled by few. Her legacy will love on through her family, her patients, and anyone who selflessly gives back to their community. She passed away on July 12, 2016.

We hope that you will come out and help us honor the families of these two great Shores legends on February 9th!

Miami Country Day School will be hosting several art exhibits and receptions in the new year. A new exhibit featuring the works of Gavin Rain and Paul Rousso will be on display beginning February 23 through March 31 with a cocktail reception on February 25th. All exhibits and receptions will take place in the school's Taplin Gallery located at 601 NE 107 St.

Sponsored by the Independent Schools of South Florida (ISSF), author and Florida historian, Arva Moore Parks, was at The Cushman School on January 12th, speaking about the impressive history of our city. Her many published works include: Miami Then and Now; Miami, the American Crossroad: A Centennial Journey, 1896-1996; and Miami, the Magic City. Mrs. Parks pointed out that Miami is a city rich with visionaries and cultural diversity as well as a tolerance for change, having seen so much evolution over the years. It is also the only major U.S. city founded by a woman, Julia Tuttle.



Just like its home city, The Cushman School was founded by a female visionary; Dr. Laura Cushman who began the school on her front porch in 1924. During this roaring decade many were lured to South Florida's tropical lifestyle and immense opportunities, and Dr. Cushman migrated here to lay the foundation for an innovative type of education. Fast forward 90 years, and we've seen both Miami (and Cushman) blossom. Cushman has enjoyed tremendous growth and has been a major contributor to the beautification of the

Biscayne Corridor. Having acquired the building at 6000 Biscayne which is now home to the school's Innovation Center and the 4700 building which is the site of the new Cushman High School as well as many properties in between, Cushman is proud of its role within our international metropolis.

Miami Shores Presbyterian Church School (MSPCS) is excited to announce the opening of their new STEM Lab. Thanks to the MSPCS Parent Association and generous donations from several families, the elementary students will benefit from a rigorous and hands on STEM curriculum. MSPCS would like to give a special thank you to preschool parents Thomas Gantt and Juan Del Hierro, without their kindness and generosity the STEM Lab would still be a dream in the making.


MSPCS is also very excited to have expanded their preschool with an additional three classrooms, and is now



BISCAYNE PARK PARTNERS WITH PEREZ ART MUSEUM MIAMI INSIDE OUT ART PROGRAM

This February, Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM) will kick off its second year of Inside|Out, a program funded by the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation which brings high-quality reproductions of art from the museum's permanent collection to the community. PAMM issued a call to participants to host this year's Inside|Out program and received 17 applications from communities all over Miami-Dade County. Six communities were chosen for this year's round of installations that will kick off this spring in Biscayne Park, Opa-Locka and Overtown. Over the summer, the reproductions will rotate to Little Haiti, North Miami Beach and Surfside.

From Fernando Botero to Edouard Duval-Carrié, 50 artists from PAMM's permanent collection will be featured in each round of Inside|Out nearly twice as many as last year. Exact locations of each reproduction will be featured on maps available at host locations and at pamm.org/insideout.

"Being Miami-Dade County's museum, it's important for us to engage the community in unique ways. Inside|Out brings a breath of fresh art to everyday life and fosters spontaneous interactions with art in the community," said PAMM Director Franklin Sirmans.

program for the second year in a row and are excited to connect with each community in such an impactful way."

"There's something very powerful about seeing works of art in person. You become completely immersed. Inside|Out brings that experience to people, directly in their communities. And an amazing thing happens: entire neighborhoods, entire communities, start to talk about art," said Victoria Rogers, vice president for arts at Knight Foundation.

Miami is the fourth city to host Inside Out, a program conceived by the Detroit Institute of Arts in 2010. It proved so successful in Detroit, the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation is providing \$2 million over three years to expand Inside Out to communities across the country, including Philadelphia and Akron, Ohio.

And Biscayne Park, described by PAMM as a community known for its tree lined medians and log cabin, has been selected for ten works of art. A committee of Biscayne Park residents, including local art lovers, chaired by Village Manager Sharon Ragoonan, has been meeting to plot the locations for the art. Stay tuned!




